The program was organized by the District Legal services Authority, SWKH, Mawkyrwat on the 28th Sept 2022 at Sngap Syiem College.

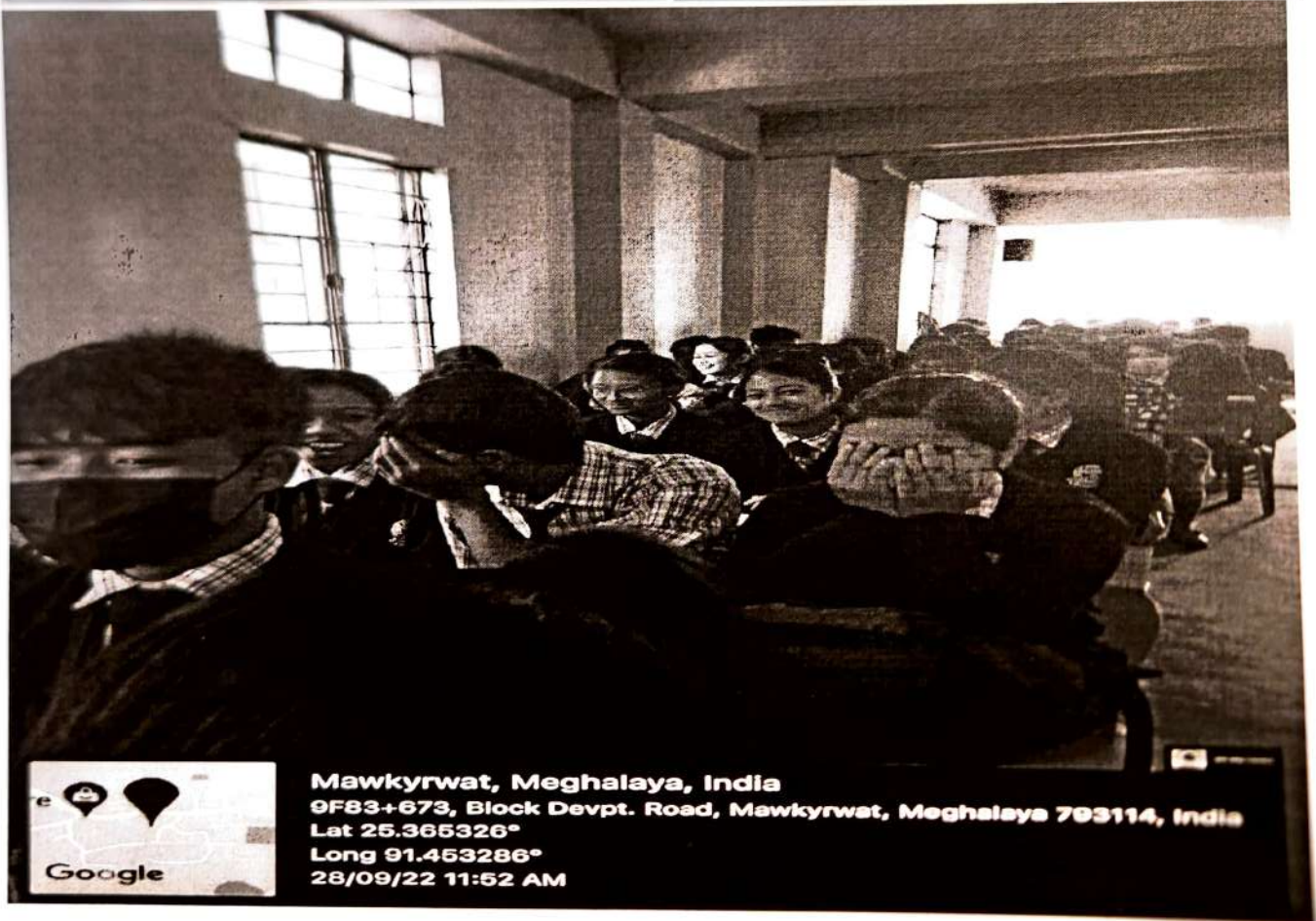

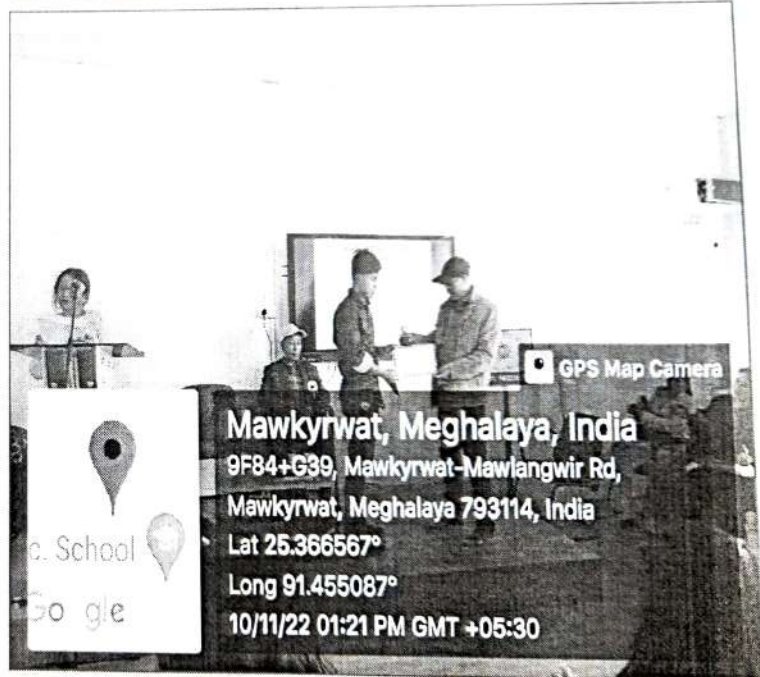
Report on the seminar

The topic included the origin, historical system, and the compatibility with the modern society, and the ethical values of the system.

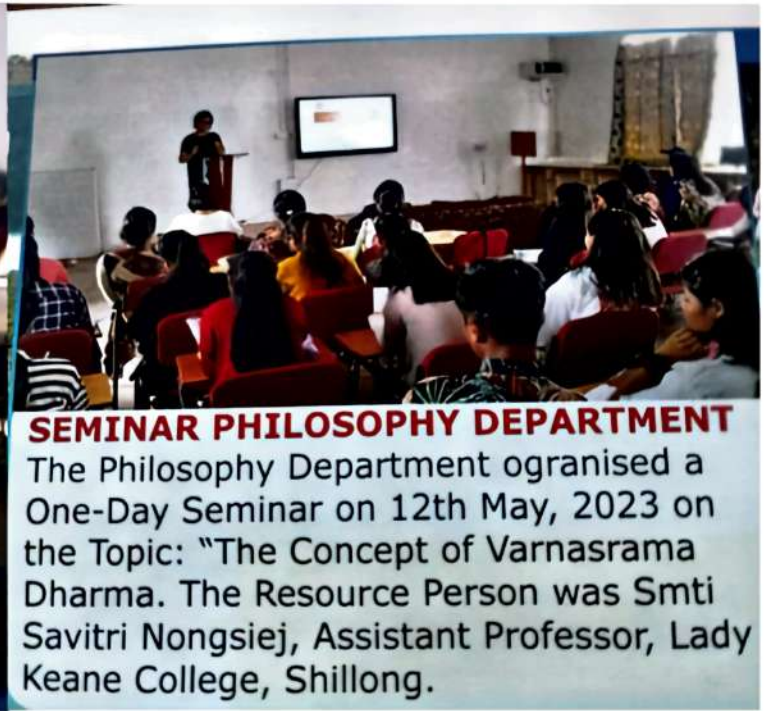
